 corded by *Wm. H. H. H.* Clerk,  
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Phillip Wolever [Senior] is found in the 1830 Tax List of Captain Susong's Company, where he was taxed on 265 1/2 acres of land on Pigeon Creek. In this same list was Phillip Junior who was taxed on 87 1/2 acres at the same location. The Estate of Phillip Junior was probated in Washington County on January 7, 1856. Another son is believed to be Peter Wolever who in 1814 is shown in the Militia Roster of Captain Robert McCalpin, owning 150 acres, also on Pigeon Creek. Peter served in the War of 1812 in Captain Thomas Wilson's Company. A third son appears to be John 'Woolhaver', age 50-59 who is enumerated next to Philip Senior, age 70-79 in the 1830 Census. The last record found for Phillip Senior is when he appears in the Greene County Pensioners Listing of 1835, age 83 who was drawing a Pension of \$30 per year. Phillip apparently died intestate before 1840.

On this 20th day of January 1834 personally  
appeared in open Court before the Court of Pleas  
and Quarter Sessions of the County aforesaid now  
sitting Phillip Wolcott a resident of <sup>the County of</sup> Greene and  
State of Tennessee aged Eighty three years  
who being first duly sworn according to Law doth  
in his oath make the following declaration, in order  
to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed  
June the 7th 1832 -

That he entered the service of the United States under  
the following named officers and served as stated  
that he was drafted (for a three months tour) in  
Berks County Pennsylvania and served under  
Captain John Lasher, or in the company com-  
manded by him - in a Regiment commanded  
by Henry Speaker - The company under the  
command of Captain St John Lasher to which this  
declarant belonged marched from Reading in  
Berks County Pennsylvania (with <sup>two</sup> other  
companies under the command of Captains  
Attler, and Force) to Bethlehem thence to  
Elizabethtown and thence to the town or city  
of Amboy - or Perth Amboy ~~where~~ in  
the State of New Jersey where this aff declarant  
remained in service until his tour of three months



had expired when he was discharged by Capt John Lashier and then he returned to Berks County Pennsylvania. This declarant was in no engagement with the enemy during this tour - which he was drafted to serve as well as he recollects in the year 1777 in the month of August. The next tour this <sup>declarant</sup> ~~affair~~ served was as a substitute for Adam Painter who had been drafted in Lancaster County <sup>in the state of Pennsylvania</sup> for a three months tour - This declarant served as a substitute for said Painter in a company commanded by Captain Wiser in a Regiment under the command of Col<sup>l</sup> Grubb he substituted as aforesaid in September 1778 as he believes and the company marched to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania - Where he remained until the three months tour had expired when he was discharged by <sup>the said</sup> Capt Wiser and then he returned home again to Berks County Pennsylvania -

The third tour this declarant served was in the Spring of 1779 as ~~he~~ <sup>he</sup> well as he remembers in March he was drafted <sup>for three months</sup> in Berks County Pennsylvania and served in a company under the command of Captain Auldenbroth in a Regiment commanded by Col<sup>l</sup> Spenker - the company marched to Slites town ~~Pennsylvania~~ (which was not a County town) in the State of Pennsylvania where this declarant was stationed together with said company to guard the Prisoners who had been taken prisoners - where he remained until the expiration of his tour of three months



when he was discharged and again returned  
to Berks County —  
during these three tours in all nine months  
this declarant was in no engagement with  
the enemy — and that he served with no contin-  
ent Regiment or company — and that he never  
had any written discharge from service of either  
of the three tours — that he has no documentary  
evidence, and that he knows of no person whose  
testimony he can procure who can testify to his ser-  
vice

This declarant states that he has no record of  
his age but he was born as he is inform-  
ed in November in the year 1751 in Berks  
County in the State of Pennsylvania that he  
was living there when called into service during  
the three tours he performed as aforesaid  
This declarant moved from Berks County Pennsylvan-  
ia in the year 1783 to York County in the  
same State where he resided about ten years  
he then moved to Rockingham County in the  
State of Virginia where he lived about seven  
years from thence he moved to Greene County  
in the State of Tennessee where he has resided  
ever since

This declarant states that George H. Brown & others  
will testify to his character for truth & their belief of his residence  
This declarant hereby relinquishes every claim whatever  
to a pension or annuity except the present, and  
declares that his name is not on the pension roll  
of the Agency of any State } This declarant states
