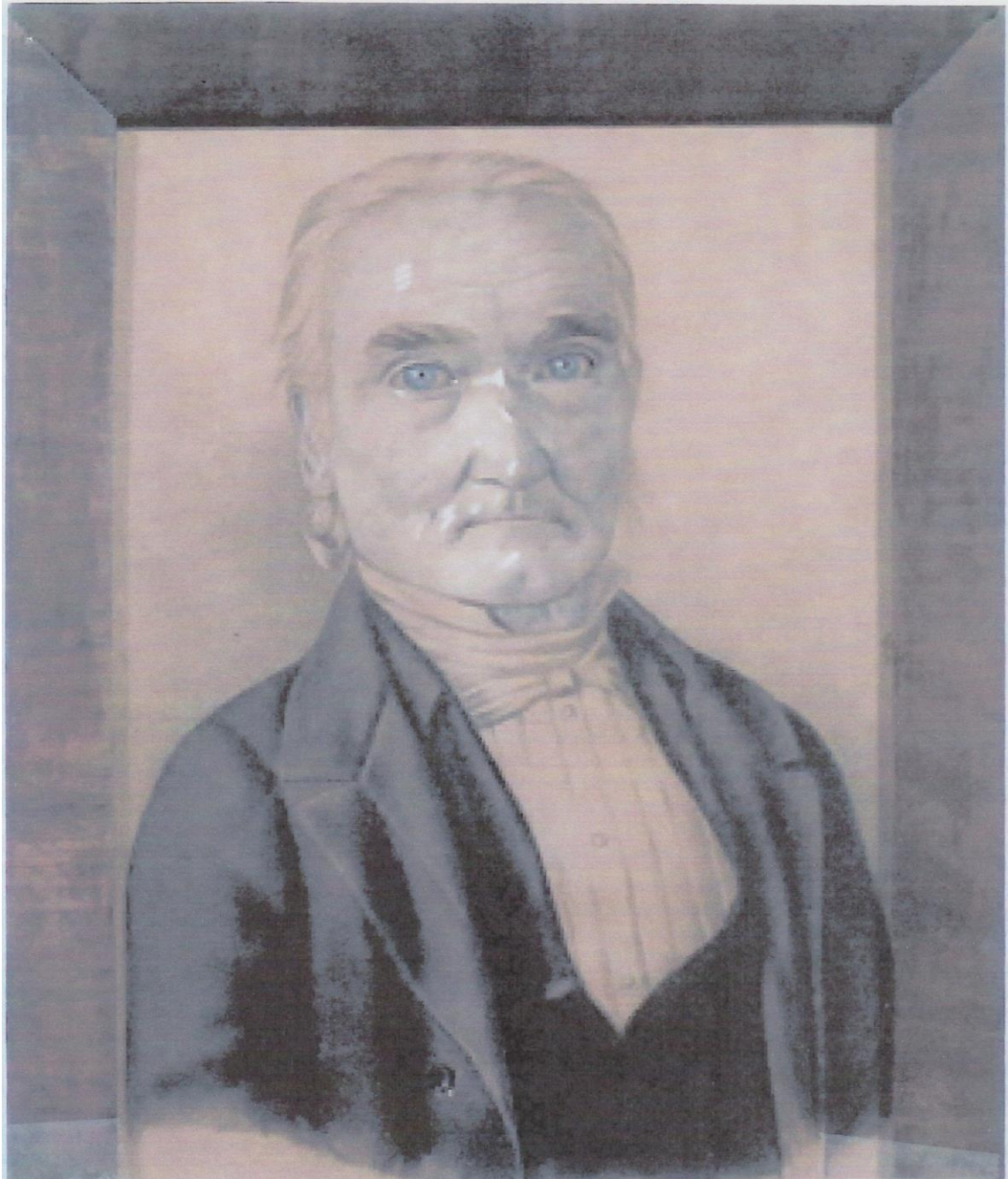

March 15, 1819 Land Indenture: David and Ewen Allison, heirs of David Allison, deceased".

1850: Neither David Junior or Elizabeth are found. No 1851 or 1855 Bounty Land Application.

1855 Widow Bounty Land: 120 acres

**Daniel Britton/Britten, Captain Robert Maloney Company**  
**[possibly never reported; no record of service or land warrants]**

Not found in 1809-1817 Districts  
Wife Margaret Gass [Marriage not in Greene County]

1830: age 30-39

March 25, 1837: contributed land for Mount Pleasant UM Church [Find-A-Grave Memorial posted to Mount Pleasant UM Church Cemetery]

1850: Daniel, age 53; Margaret, age 52

1855: Bounty Land: 120 acres

Died before 1858

1860, P.O. Timber Ridge: Margaret, age 62

No Widow Pension [1878 Act]

March 15, 1871 Application for Pension: Resides Greene County, age 74, married May 18, 1861 Sarah Lemmons; Attorney B. McDannel, Greeneville

1813: Captain Jacob Hoyal District

1830: Not found as a head-of-household

1840: Not found as a head-of household

1850: Not find in Greene County Census

October 3, 1853 Will Probated; no wife named; bequests to Brannon family; Executor Blackstone McDannel; Witness John Maloney [a son of Captain Robert Maloney]

#### **George Brown, Deputy Quartermaster: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

1813: Captain Jacob Hoyle District;

August 18, 1807 married Peggy Trobaugh

1830: age 40-49, no wife

1840: age 50-59, no wife

No Bounty Land Warrants, indicating he died prior to the 1851 Act.

#### **Jotham [Junior] Brown: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

**[Brother-in-Law of Captain Robert Maloney; Uncle of William Brown]**

1812 Captain Walter Clark District

October 8, 1807 married Margaret "Peggy" Maloney (1787-1858, buried with Jotham [sister of Captain Robert Maloney])

1830: age 40-49

1840: age 50-59

1850: Jotham, age 67; Margaret, age 64

1855 Bounty Land: 120 acres

Cross Anchor Cemetery: Born October 3, 1783; Died July 21, 1859

**William Brown: Captain Robert Maloney Company and  
Joseph Hale Company**

[Son of David Brown, served with his father in Captain Joseph Hale Company]

William is not shown on Roster of Captain Hale; Affidavit for Bounty Land Application by his stepmother, Milly Harmon Perry Brown.]

1815 Captain Henry Bowman District

June 11, 1816 married Elizabeth 'Betsy' Hankins Brown, married June 11, 1816

November 3, 1845: Invalid Pension Application: age 49, filed Greene County. "Substituted for Hugh Maloney in the Company commanded by Captain Joseph Hale. Served six months in place of Hugh Maloney, deceased. A foot soldier... marched with the troops a distance of 800 miles to Mobile in the State of Alabama... marching day and night. " [Hugh Maloney was a brother of Captain Robert Maloney.]

October 20, 1847: Letter by Andrew Johnson to Pension Office; Affidavit by Cornelius Hughes.

February 7, 1854: Affidavit by Lt. David Farnsworth, age 68.

Awarded Pension \$6/month, "3/4th's disability".

November 2, 1854: married Lucinda Babb Babb (widow of Archibald Babb)

1860: William, age 65; Lucinda, age 40

July 18, 1862: Signed Will, "second wife Lucinda"; Will Probated October 3, 1864

Price Cemetery, Romeo: Born: August 6, 1797; Died: February 3, 1864

[William's Descendants founded Brown's Mountain Cemetery on the cusp of Greene and Hawkins Counties.]

**James Callihan: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

1811 Captain David White District

May 24, 1817 married Cynthia Black

1830: James, age 40-50

1840: Not found

No Bounty Land Warrants indicating James was deceased before 1851.

**James Campbell: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

1813 Captain Francis Register District

October 29, 1913: "deserted"

Wife: Priscilla (marriage not in Greene County)

1850: James, age 67; Priscilla, age 59

**Ellis/Elias Carter: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

[Son of Daniel Carter, Revolutionary War Soldier, Will July 27, 1829]

1814 Captain Thomas Smith District

March 4, 1814 married Susana Anderson

1830: Ellis, age 30-39; Susan, age 20-29

1840: Ellis, age 40-49; Susan, age 30-39

June 8, 1848 married Rhodia Burns

1850: Elias, age 53; wife Rhody, age 48

1855: Bounty Land, 80 acres

Carter Cemetery on Mountain Gap Road: Elias (1794-1863); Rhoda (1810-1878) No Widow Pension (Act of 1878)

**Elijah Carter: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

[Son of Levi Carter, Will December 5, 1809]

1814 Captain Thomas Smith District

August 15, 1811 married Susana "Cassel"/Casteel (1795-1859)

1840 Rush County, Indiana: Elijah, age 50-59; Susannah, age 40-49

May 1, 1846: Land Entry filed, Gentry County, MO

1850 Gentry County, MO: Elija, age 64; Susannah, age 50

Died November 13, 1858, buried Carter Cemetery, Gentry County, Missouri

**Jeremiah Casteel: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

1812 Captain Thomas Smith District

February 17, 1813: married Susana Jones

1830: Jeremiah, age 30-39; Susana, age 30-39

1840: Jeremiah, age 50-59; Susana, age 40-49

1850 Greene County: age 79, widower

[No Bounty Land Warrants are found, suggesting Jeremiah died shortly after the 1850 census.]

Probably buried on their farm, which may be a portion of today's Malone Cemetery on Union Road and near Casteel Road.

**George Cunningham: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

Not found in 1809-17 Tax/Militia Districts

April 24, 1815: purchased 42 acres on Lick Creek

April 1, 1820: purchased 15 acres on Limestone Fork

1850 Monroe County, KY: George, age 56; Harriet, age 50, born South Carolina

1851 Bounty Land: 40 acres

1855 Bounty Land: 80 acres, lives Monroe County, KY

Died: March 22, 1869, Monroe County, KY

April 3, 1879 Widow Pension: Harried Howard, filed April 3, 1879 Kentucky; married April 30,

1850, Monroe County, KY. Soldier's first Wife: Polly Lacky

1880: Hariett Cunninham, age 80, born South Carolina

Mount Gilead Church of Christ Cemetery, Tompkinsville, KY: Harriet born October 6, 1799; died April 19, 1892

**Edward Day: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

Not found in 1809-17 Tax/Militia Districts

October 29, 1813: discharged, "unable to perform duty", pay \$4.12

February 9, 1814: married Eleanor Deinkin/Duncan, Greene County

1850: possibly lived in Campbell County, TN, age 60, "Pauper"

**Thomas Davis [Junior]: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

Note: There were three men named Thomas Davis at the time of the War of 1812. Based on the names of soldiers in the Robert Maloney Company, the man probably is:

Son of Thomas Senior and Sarah Walker Davis [married April 7, 1795], Sarah's Will January 27, 1835: "Thomas lives with William McAmish, Junior."

1813 Captain Joseph Hale District

August 7, 1811 married Rebecca Wright (1792-1859), buried Hillsdale Cemetery, Mills County, Iowa

1830: age 40-49; wife age 30-39

1840: age 50-59; wife 40-49

1850: Nicholas, age 63; Rebecca, age 58

1851 Bounty Land: filed Greene County "Volunteered Greene Co.", 40 acres

1855 Bounty Land: filed Mills County, Iowa, 120 acres

December 13, 1863: married Caroline Varner, Cocke County[ as stated in Soldier's Pension application]

1870: Nicholas, age 80; Caroline, age 42

February 14, 1871 Pension Application: age 81, lives Big Creek Station, Cocke County

**Emanuel Dyke, Fifer: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

1814 Captain Thomas McSpaddin

September 16, 1811 married Fannie Wilson

1830: Not found in Census

Died before March 1832 [widow, Fannie remarried Heironemus Dyche on March 13, 1832; Chancery Court record]

**Robert Foster: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

[Brother-in-Law of John and Joseph Johns(t)on, in same Company]

1813: Captain Jacob Hoyal District

November 10, 1802 Married Mercy/Marsy Johns(t)on Johnson

1830: Robert, age 40-50; Marsy, age 40-50

Died before August 1833 [Estate Inventory, Mercy Foster, Executor; Mercy/Marsy Johns(t)on Johnson (died before April 1850, Estate Inventory)]

**Jesse Foshea 'Forshay': Captain Robert Maloney Company**

Not found in the 1809-1817 Tax/Militia List Greene.

No service records/bounty lands/pensions are found in Tennessee. One record is found for him in Greene County:

September 20, 1816: Jesse 'Forchee' witnesses a Land Deed for Hartley

[He may be - or is an under-aged son of John "Foashe" who is in 1809 Captain Benjamin Neil's District and appears one time in the 1809-1817 Greene County Districts List. December 11, 1794: John "Forshay" married Agnes Weston, bond by Isaac Armitage, who is in the same 1809 District List; and who in 1813 is in Captain Thomas Smith District. These are North Greene County men, many who live in the Romeo/Baileyton area. Orphan Court Record, April 1809 Term: "State vs George Starnes -- beating and ill treating an orphan boy, Joseph Foshie - boy taken from his services and transferred to Simon Weston."

**Richard Foshea 'Forshee'/Foshe/Fashee: Captain Robert Maloney Company** Not found in the 1809-1817 Tax/Militia List Greene.

March 12, 1813: Witnesses a Land Deed for 'Harty'.

January 4, 1815 married Bitsey Fisher

1830: Monroe County, age 30-39

1850: Bounty Land Application, age 63 filed Monroe County, TN; awarded 40 acres

March 28, 1855: Bounty Land Application, 120 acres, filed Monroe County, TN April 10,

1872: Invalid Pension Application; "Rejected": 'in sympathy with enemy during rebellion'.

[Before the Civil War, a man's Loyalty was never questioned and Bounty Land Warrants under the Acts of 1851 and 1855 were awarded. After the Civil War, for the old soldiers of the War of 1812 to receive Pension (under the 1871 Act), Loyalty Statements and Affidavits were required. In some instances, previously awarded Pensions were "suspended" until Loyalty could be confirmed.] Died January 11, 1872, Monroe County

April 4, 1878 Widow Pension filed Monroe County: Susan Wolf, married September 1848, Monroe County; Awarded \$8/month.

**John Freshour (Junior), Cpl: Captain Robert Maloney Company and  
Captain James Penny's Company**

Son of John Freshour Senior, Revolutionary War Soldier [Will March 2, 1801]

1812: Captain Thomas Wilson District

January 1, 1808 married Mary Magdaline Peters

1850: John, age 66; Margaret age 57

1851 Bounty Land Application: Resides Cedar Creek, Greene Co.; Awarded 40 acres

1855: Bounty Land, 120 acres

1870: John, age 87; wife age 81  
Died November 16, 1870; Believed to be buried in St. James Lutheran Church Cemetery.  
October 14, 1873: Widow Pension

**John Given/Garvin: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

1812: Captain William Guinn District  
August 29, 1805 married Mary Hood  
March 3, 1815: purchased 4 acres on Richland Creek  
1830 "Garvin": age 60-70  
1840 Not found

**John Gass, Cpl: Captain Maloney Company TN Militia and  
Captain George Gregory Company**

1809-1817 Tax/Militia District: Undetermined  
March 26, 1818 married Anna Cox  
1850 Jefferson County: John, age 63; Anna, age 52  
1851 Bounty Land 80 acres  
1855 Bounty Land 80 acres  
May 15, 1855 Greene County: married Nancy Gass.  
May 25, 1867, Jefferson County: signed Will; Probated October 1871  
1870 Jefferson County: John age 81, Nancy age 61  
June 26, 1871 Invalid Pension application: resides Jefferson, wife Nancy Gass, "married May  
1856 "at the house of Charles Gass in Greene County"

**James Gladden [Junior?]: [Captain Robert Maloney Company?]  
2nd Regiment, Lillard's East TN Vol and Captain Charles Lewin Company**

[Possibly son of James Gladden Senior, Revolutionary War, or Benjamin Gladden]  
Not shown on the Muster Roll of Capt. Maloney  
Enlistment record: 2nd Regiment, Lillard's [infers Robert Maloney Company]  
Enlisted in Cocke County in Captain Lewin Company [Pension application of brother, William]  
1816 Captain Gilbert Woolsey District  
March 24, 1818 Greene County married Omey Wilson  
[No record of Bounty Land, indicating soldier was deceased before 1851]

**Joseph Gladden: Captain Robert Maloney Company and  
Captain Charles Lewin Company**

[Brother of James Gladden]

Not in 1809-1917 Tax/Militia Districts Lists, although in Greene County Land Registers in 1816.  
Enlisted in Cocke County in Captain Lewin Co. [Pension application of brother, William.]  
Born September 28, 1772  
1815: Land owner in Cocke County  
1850: Lived Benton County, Alabama



1855: Bounty Land 160 acres, filed under Captain Maloney Company  
Wife 1: Amy Beason (1784-1820); Wife 2: Martha Jane Price Collins (1796-1869) [Family information, Find-A-Grave]  
Died: March 14, 1859, buried Gladden Cemetery, Calhoun County, Alabama

**James Gooden/Goodin: Captain Robert Maloney Company, 3rd  
Regiment Lillard E. Tennessee Vol.**

1813 Captain Thomas Smith District  
Enlistment only; No Bounty Land; No Pension  
December 30, 1806 married Mahala Cox  
1840: Benjamin Gooden, age 50-59  
Died before 1841 Chancery Court: "Benjamin Gooden, Administrator of James Gooden, deceased, and Guardian of minor heirs: Matthew, Valentine, Polly C. and Hannah N. Gooden.

**William Guinn, Cpl.: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

1812: Captain William Guinn District  
May 5, 1818 Rhea County: married Margaret Woodward [Widow Pension Application]  
1836: Civil Districts created, William Guinn's "plantation" cited as boundary line between District 10 [Town of Greeneville and District 13 [today's Tusculum area]  
1850 Rhea County: William, age 53; Margaret, age 53  
1851 Bounty Land 40 acres  
1855 Bounty Land 120 acres  
Pension October 19, 1871: Resides Washington County and Rhea County, TN  
Died November 21, 1871 Washington County  
September 18, 1879 Widow Pension Application

**John Edward Hankins: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

[Brother of William A. Hankins]

Son of William Hankins Senior, Will April 25, 1821: sons, William and John E. Hankins, "200 acres I now live on, purchased from Joshua Kidwell [buried Kidwell Cemetery]; Executors John E. and William Hankins (Junior).

1815 Captain Henry Bowman District  
November 11, 1819: purchased along with William A. Hankins and John Carter, 180 acre tract on Lick Creek. Died before 1840  
Wife: Sarah Farnsworth Gass (1788-1858) [marriage not in Greene County]  
1840: Sarah, age 40-50  
February 3, 1840 Orphan Court: Sarah Hankins guardian to Mary, Nancy A., and John.  
1850: Sarah, age 62 and John E. Junior, age 28  
1855: Widow Bounty Land, 120 acres  
Buried Hankins Family Cemetery, North Greene County [Cemetery recently restored]

**William A. Hankins Jr., Sgt.: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

[Brother of John E. Hankins Senior]

Son of William Hankins Senior, Will April 25, 1821: sons, William and John E. Hankins, "200 acres I now live on, purchased from Joshua Kidwell [buried Kidwell Cemetery]; Executors John E. and William Hankins (Junior).

1813 Captain Henry Bowman District

January 28, 1822: married Perlina Farnsworth

1830: William, age 30-39

1840: William, age 40-49

1850: William, age 59; Perlina age 45

Will probated March 3, 1851

Buried in Hankins Family Cemetery near White House Rd.

**John Hardin [Jr.]: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

Son of John Hardin Senior, Revolutionary War Soldier

1813 Captain Francis Register District

February 12, 1808 married Clarissa Newman (1787-1873, buried with John)

1830: John, age 40-49; Clarissa, age 40-49

1840: John, age 50-59; Clarissa, age 50-59

1850: Clarissa, age 63

1855 Widow Bounty Land: 120 acres "soldier served full period of sixty days"

March 14, 1871 Widow Pension Application: Soldier died December 25, 1845, filed Greene County, age 83; Pensioned \$8/month

Kidwell Cemetery: Born November 25, 1788; Died December 25, 1844 [Tombstone]

**Peter Harmon, 1st Lt.: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

**[Later commissioned Captain when Robert Maloney resigned.]**

**[Greene County Pioneer Vol. 28, Number 2, pages 129-141]**

Son of John Harmon Sr., a Revolutionary War Soldier [Will probated 1837: Sons Peter, Benjamin (deceased), John Junior & Jacob]

1813 Captain Thomas McSpaddin District

February 24, 1820 married Elizabeth "Betsy" Bowman (1794-1882, buried with Peter) [Daughter of Sparling Bowman, Revolutionary War Soldier]

December 14, 1851 Bounty Land: age 65; 40 acres; Affidavit by David Rice, 1st Lt.

April 21, 1855 Bounty Land: age "69 or 70"; 120 acres

March 9, 1878 Widow Pension Application: Filed Greene Co, age 84; Agent B. McDannel; Application "presented in person to Pension Commission by Andrew Johnson"; Pensioned \$8/month.

Harmon Graveyard [in the 20th Century known as Mt. Vernon Cemetery]:

1830: age 30-39; wife, age 20-29  
1840: age 40-49; wife, age 40-49  
1850 Newton County, Missouri: Daniel, age 56; Nancy, age 49  
1851: Bounty Land, 40 acres, resides Newton County, Missouri  
April 5, 1856: Bounty Land, age 61, filed Newton County, Missouri; "volunteered in Greene County, TN"; Awarded 120 acres.  
May 25, 1871: Pension: "Hartley", age, 74, lives Newton Co., Missouri.  
Died January 22, 1876; buried Powers Cemetery, Newton County, Missouri

**David Harty/Hartley: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

Not found in 1809-1817 District List  
Not found in Greene County Census and no marriage record  
No Bounty Land Warrants (Act of 1851)  
October 1845 Chancery Court Record: "possessions sold for debts owed" [possibly deceased]

**John High: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

"Discharged, unable to perform duty; Pay: \$4.12  
Not in 1809-1817 Districts Lists  
August 30, 1810: possibly married Lucy Martin in North Carolina  
Not in Greene County Census  
1850: possibly lived in Smith County, TN: John age 71, born NC; wife Rebecca, age 68  
1860: Smith County, TN: John, age 82  
[said to be father of Martin High (1806-1887), buried Cross Anchor]

**David Rice Holt: 2nd Regiment (Lillard's) E. TN Volunteers**  
**[Possibly Infers service in Captain Robert Maloney Company]**  
[Brother of Joseph Holt]

Not found in 1809-1917 Districts  
Son of David Holt, Revolutionary War Soldier (1764-1837, buried Holt-Moore Graveyard), Will signed December 16, 1836; Sons: Joseph, David R., John P. Executors: Joseph and David Rice Holt]  
Not in Greene County Marriages  
January 16, 1821: Witness for Deed of Father, David.  
Not in or after 1830 Greene County  
No Bounty Land or Pension records

**Joseph Holt, Sgt.: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

[Brother of David Rice Holt; Brother-in-Law of John Wear Wilson]

Son of David Holt, Revolutionary War Soldier (1764-1837, buried Holt-Moore Graveyard), Will signed December 16, 1836; Sons: Joseph, David R., John P. Executors: Joseph and David Rice Holt]

1812 Captain Jacob Hoyal District

June 30, 1800: married Sally Clarke

1850: Sarah Holt, age 70, born New Jersey; resided with James W. Galbreath (married June 22, 1829 Jane Moore)

December 28, 1850: Widow Bounty Land Application: Joseph died "1824-25 near Bolivar, TN";

March 26, 1855: Widow Bounty Land Application: age 74; Affidavits by Seburn Jewel and John R. Moore [grandchildren of David Holt].

1860: Sarah Holt, age 79; resided with James W. Galbreath, age 55, and wife, Jane

1870: Sarah Holt, age 89; resided with Jane Galbreath (widow of James), age 69

February 14, 1871 Widow Pension Application; Pensioned August 8, 1871; \$8/month

Sarah's Date of Death is not known; Tombstone in Holt-Moore Graveyard, originally located on today's Airport property was relocated in 2010. During excavation of graves, no remains were found at Sarah's tombstone. She may be buried at Mt. Bethel Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

November 20, 1820 married Eliza Green/Guin

April 27, 1818 Deputy Sheriff in Greeneville [Deed Book]

October 1833: "High Sheriff is dead" [Chancery Court, November 1833]

**John Hybarger: Captain Robert Maloney Company**

1814 Captain Thomas McSpadden District

May 12, 1813 married Agnes Magill (1786-1856)
