1. The above names are shown in Reynolds Cemetery transcriptions as buried in Hendry Cemetery			
2. Civil War soldiers Elias H and Leonard T Rhea military tombstone applications give place of burial as Bowman Springs/Bowman Cemetery "near Locust Grove". The brother's father, James Rhea, died before 1850. Their mother, Locky Starnes Rhea, remained unmarried and disappears from census records after 1870. James and Locky lived in Locust Grove. They may be buried here in unmarked graves.			
3. Rolant and Mary "Polly" Bowman Ellis have shared tombstones at Mt. Zion. Rolant may have been a casualty of the Civil War since he died June 18, 1864. It is possible Rolant is not interred in Mt. Zion. Their children Jesse and William D. likewise have shared tombstones at Mt Zion in the exact size, style and form as the parents; thus, the shared marker at Zion for these children is commemorative.
