1850: Elizabeth, age 72, in household of John A. Brown, "Merchant"

[Elizabeth lived sufficiently long to have filed for Bounty Land.]

Old Harmony Graveyard, Greeneville: Joseph, died November 1, 1845

**Walter Clark, Lt: Captain James Penny Company
and Captain Walter Clark Company**

1814 Captain Henry Bowman District: "Report of the Men in the Service of the U. States"

December 31, 1803 married Elizabeth Bowman (1784-1840), Greene County

1830 Parke County, Indiana: age 40-49

1834 Fountain County, Indiana: purchased 40 acres of land

1840: Fountain County, Indiana: age 59-59

Died May 12, 1840; buried Zackmire Cemetery, Fountain County, Indiana

**Thomas Davis: Captain James Penny Company
Bunch's Regimen East Tennessee Volunteers**

[Possibly Brother-in-Law of James Dinsmore in same Company]

[This man's name appears to be appended to the end of the Roster, whereas, the other names are more or less listed in alphabetical order.]

A man of this name is found in the same 1812 District as Captain James Penny; however, he was a Revolutionary War soldier (1739-1826, buried Zion Presbyterian), and he would be much too elderly to be in the War of 1812. Furthermore, this man was very affluent and would not have served as a Private. This Thomas left a Will probated in October Session 1826, naming sons John, James H. and William. He did not name a son, Thomas, however, Thomas could have been a nephew:

The War of 1812 Soldier appears to be:

November 24, 1824 married Levina Dinsmore; bondsman William D. Miller (he also served in Captain Penny's Company as did James Dinsmore; and in 1830 William D. Miller also lived on Camp Creek).

October 6, 1856 Will Probated: everything bequeathed to his wife, no children were named.

James Dinsmore: Captain James Penny Company

[Possibly Brother-in-Law of Thomas Davis in same Company]

Son of Samuel Dinsmore [Chancery Court, May Term 1847, Lawsuit brought by Henry A. Farnsworth resulting in forfeiture of land distributed to James by Samuel]

October 5, 1808 married Mary Moore, bondsman Samuel Dinsmore

1814 Captain Thomas Wilson District

1830 Greene: James, age 40-49; Mary age 40-49

1840 not found in Greene County

1850 Laurel County, KY: James, age 60, "blacksmith" living with others; no wife in household

1851 Bounty Land application: filed Laurel County, KY; Wife Polly Moore deceased. Received 40 acres

November 25, 1856 Bounty Land: 120 acres

1870 Greene: James, age 79, enumerated at the Poor Farm

March 21, 1871 Invalid Pension application: age 82, filed Greene County: enlisted Greenville for 3 months. Letter by B. M. McDannel to Pension Commission: James Dinsmore "is stone blind and lives in the County Poorhouse". Loyalty Affidavits by Wilson McAmis and William McAmis.

Said to be buried at Mt. Pisgah UM [Reynolds Cemeteries, no tombstone]. He may be buried in the Poor Farm Cemetery, long disappeared. William McAmis managed the Poor Farm.

No Greene County records found; Not in any census.

No Bounty Land or Pension Records

1850 Cocke County: He may be the man of this name, age 57, born Virginia, with wife Margaret, age 48.

Ralph Ford: Captain James Penny Company

[probably brother of William Ford]

February 1817 Orphans Court: "Sally and Comfort Ford, minor heirs of Ralph Ford deceased, age 14 years of age chose William Ford their guardian."

[Orphan, Sally Ford, married Henry Jones December 31, 1822 in Greene County. Sally (1800-1867) and Henry (1805-1838) are buried in Cicero Cemetery, Hamilton County, Indiana.

Orphan, Comfort Ford, married Alexander Jones (place unknown). Comfort (1800-1878) and Alexander (1806-1884) are buried in the Jones Family Cemetery, Keokuk County, Iowa.]

Appears to have never married; Lived with brother, Aaron, 1840-1870
1851: No Bounty Land Application
1855: No Bounty Land Application
1871: No Pension Application
September 6, 1875 Will: All property bequeathed to brothers and sisters: Aaron; Thomas; Phebe; and Abraham.
[Francis and all of his family are probably buried in a Family Cemetery, long lost.]

[Possibly brother of Isaac and Jon/Jonathan Justice]

1850: Margaret, age 51, appears to be a widow(?) with 7 children in the house
May 15, 1852 Invalid Pension Application filed Greene County, age 71, resides Caney Branch.
Pension rejected because of no proof of disability related to service.
1855: Bounty Land: 120 acres; Affidavit by Solomon Fann.

**William Kilgore: Captain James Penny Company,
Col. Samuel Bunch Regiment**

1813: Captain John Kilgore District
No definitive information is available on this man. He or his widow filed for Bounty Land in 1855, receiving 120 acres. He or his widow possibly lived in Cocke County.

James Luny/Loonie, Ensign: Captain James Penny Company

Not in 1809-17 Tax/Militia Districts [A Jeremiah Loney is in Captain Stephen Johnson's District, owning 164 acres on Waters of Camp Creek. He may be the father of James.]

No marriage in Greene County; No census record in Greene County

**Henry Mc Coy: Captain James Penny Company,
4th Bayless E. TN Militia**

This man is unidentified. He does not appear to be William Henry McCoy, "Squire Billie", born March 30, 1797; died May 14, 1878 and buried at Gethsemane. No Bounty Land Applications are available for surnames after "L"; however, "Squire Billie" did not apply for, nor receive, a Pension under the 1871 Pension Act. In the event he is "Squire Billy", he did not fulfill his enlistment period to qualify for Pension.

Thomas McMahan: Captain James Penny Company

The identify of this man is uncertain: 1812 and 1813 Captain Abraham Fellers/G'Fellers (South
Greene County):

John Reynolds, 373 areas Camp Creek (died intestate or left before 1830). It is possible he is the
man in Captain James Penny Company, although size of his land holdings indicates he is an
older man.

Jesse, Vinson; Witness William and John Malone. On July 14, 1814 John and Jesse bought 222

Canehill Cemetery, Washington County, Arkansas: Mariah: Died 1885; Joseph is probably in an unmarked grave. [Numerous Greene County Families settled in Canehill, Arkansas and are buried in the cemetery. After the Civil War a "mass exodus" by Greene County's Confederate soldiers moved there.]

[Believed to be a son of Major John Sevier Junior, [a son of General John Sevier], (1766-1845 buried in the Sevier Family Cemetery in Jonesboro)

August 18, 1817 married Polly Thompson

1830: Greene, Warrensburg area: John Sevier, age 60-70; one male age 20-30. He may be Major John Sevier (1766-1845), age 60-69 [married Elizabeth Conway], who died in Jonesborough and buried in a Family Cemetery: Major John Sevier (1766-1845). He may be the father of Private John Sevier and Private James Sevier in Bunch's Mounted Regiment.

1830 Greene: James, age 30-40; Polly, age 20-30

No other records are identifiable in Greene County.

Some Family Records state James: born 1788; died 1855, Jefferson County, Illinois, with census records as "Severs". If this YOD is correct Bounty Land Warrants should be available from the National Archives. Other records state: born 1791; Died 1840.

**John (Augustus?) Sevier (Private): Captain James Penny Company,
Bunch's Regiment Mounted, East Tennessee Volunteers**

[Possibly brother of Private James Sevier]

[Believed to be a son of Major John Sevier Junior, [a son of General John Sevier], (1766-1845 buried in the Sevier Family Cemetery in Jonesboro)

Not found in 1809-17 Militia Districts Lists

No records identifiable in Greene County.

1830: Greene, Warrensburg area: John Sevier, age 60-70; one male age 20-30. He may be Major John Sevier (1766-1845), age 60-69 [married Elizabeth Conway] who died in Jonesborough and buried in a Family Cemetery: Major John Sevier (1766-1845). He may be the father of Private John Sevier and Private James Sevier in Bunch's Mounted Regiment.

Some Family Records state John: born 1789; died 1827.

**William Shannon: Captain James Penny Company,
Bunch's Regiment Mounted East Tennessee Vol.**

1812 Captain Jacob Hoyal District

Not found in Greene County in or after 1830

June 27, 1827 Jefferson Co.: married Mary Ann McCuiston (1802-1840, buried with William)

[Note: two marriages in Greene County are found for a man of this name; however, he appears to be a younger man named in the Orphan Court Records: "April 28, 1823, William Shannon, near 17 years, apprenticed to Richard West." He, too, is never found in a census in Greene County.]

Bethesda Cemetery, Morristown: William: Born June 11, 1795; Died December 6, 1855.

[Second wife may be Rachel Nicholson (1816-1872), marriage date and place not known, buried Hopewell Presbyterian Cemetery, Jefferson County, TN. Fold 3 Bounty Land and Pension records are not available to verify this.]

No records found in Greene County 1830 or thereafter for Thomas or Rebecca.
