Allen's Bridge), Kerbaugh-Myers Graveyard, Kesterson Graveyard, Lyle Graveyard, Maloney Cemetery (Warrensburg), McCorkle/Neilson Graveyard, Moore Graveyard, Wells-Farnsworth Cemetery, Old Murphy Graveyard, Harold Graveyard, Seaton Graveyard (Cedar Creek), Old 1st. U.B. Cemetery (abandoned), Hendry Graveyard (North Greene High School), Old Ailshie Graveyard, Rudder Graveyard, King Graveyard, King Graveyard (near Galbreath), Long Graveyard, Unnamed Graveyard (West Main Street), Stroud Graveyard, Willoughby Graveyard, Brown Graveyard (near Willoughby's Church), Nicholas Everhart Cemetery, Malone Cemetery (near Ottway), Hawkins Cemetery (Mohawk), Sexton Cemetery (Paint Creek), Stills-Darnell Cemetery (South Greene), Stevens-Williams Graveyard, White Graveyard (Baileyton Road), Old Jackson Graveyard (Chimney Top Mountain), Hall Graveyard, Old Woolsey Cemetery, Broyles-Kiker Cemetery, and an unknown number of which we are unaware.

Some of these private graveyards are no longer accessible. Sadly, some have been destroyed.
