It is believed by some that Lt. Isaac White is buried in White Cemetery in Washington County; however, a comment has been placed on Find-A-Grave that the man buried in White Cemetery is not the Revolutionary War Soldier.

The tombstone shown below placed in White Cemetery is a privately obtained marker. It is not a Military Marker obtained through the Veterans Administration. Note the dates of birth and death are not consistent with the D.A.R. record.
