

FREDERICK EMERT/EMMERT

Frederic Emert/Emmert is a documented soldier of Pennsylvania by the D. A. R.: born October 11, 1754 PA; died January 7, 1829 TN; wife Barbara Knight.


Only one record is identified for Frederick while he lived in Greene County, when the Chancery Court recorded Frederick 'Emmit' selling 200 acres of land to Jacob Hise [see his record of Revolutionary War service] on February 10, 1795. This is about the time, Frederick moved to Sevier County, settling in Emerts Cove. This location is known today for the spectacular covered bridge, paying tribute to the area's first settler, Frederick Emert. Frederick and Barbara are buried in the Family Cemetery nearby.
